This Week's Good News



Dear Friends.

In Today's Gospel, Jesus tells us to remain vigilant. We know neither the day or the hour when he will return. The Lord will come on the second or third watch, and he asks us to be ready for that day.

For those who have turned their backs on God, he will return completely unexpectedly, like a thief in the night. For the Christian, when the Lord arrives, he should find us prepared, awake and vigilant. He should find us giving due value to earthly affairs, but remembering that none of this is permanent or of lasting value.

We need to be vigilant in our love towards others and to remember the little things we do that may seem of no consequence to us, but to others may be the difference between faith or disillusionment. We can do this by a daily examination of conscience, at the end of a day's toil, a moment to sit in silence and reflect on how we have served God that day.

We are vigilant when we deepen our daily examination of conscience. To take a look at how we behave towards ourselves and others. To conquer those failings and temptations we all face daily.

St Frances De Sales emphasises the importance of conquering in small temptations. 'it's easy to avoid homicide, but how difficult to avoid anger over little things. It is easy not to spread false rumours about our neighbour, but difficult to avoid lying in our conversations.'

When Jesus tells his disciples to be ready, to keep awake, he is calling us to live each day in faithfulness, attentive to his promise to return in glory.

St. Maximilian Kolbe (1894 – 1941)

Feast 14th August

Maximilan Kolbe (born Raymund Kolbe) was a Polish Franciscan friar. He had a vision of the Virgin Mary when he was twelve. At some point, after being reprimanded by his mother, he presented himself before the Blessed Virgin Mary and humbly asked her the same question his mother had asked him: "what would become of him if he continued his naughty behavior".

In response, Our Lady showed him two crowns: one red, the other white. When asked to choose which he preferred, he chose both: to remain pure and undivided in his love for God and the Blessed Virgin, and to be a martyr. Only a saint can make such a generous choice!

In 1910, Raymond Kolbe entered the novitiate of the Conventual Franciscans. Being invested with the Franciscan habit, he was given the new name of "Friar Maximilian Mary."

Friar Maximilian gradually discovered that in order to be a saint, one must be conformed to the likeness of Christ, a likeness which is authenticated in the perfection of the Immaculate. Throughout his life he actively promoted the Immaculate Virgin Mary and is known as the Apostle of Consecration to Mary.

On February 17, 1941, Father Maximilian was arrested by the Nazis for a second time. He would translate his theological and spiritual insights into practical words and actions for his fellow inmates, by tangibly showing that there is God. Love and hope exist even in the midst of horrific genocide in the camps of Auschwitz.

Father Maximilian volunteered, in a heroic act of charity, to be the victim in place of a stranger who was a family man. The result of this self-offering was that Father Maximilian would be assigned to the infamous starvation bunker where he would slowly but surely die: "no greater love than this, that a man lays down his life for his friend" (Jn 15:12).

On the vigil of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, after two weeks of starvation, Father Maximilian's ordeal was brought to an end by an injection of carbolic acid. Out of ten men, he was the last to die, very providentially on the feast of Our Lady's Assumption into heaven!

Pope John Paul II canonised Father Kolbe on the 10th October 1982.

St. Maximilian Kolbe is venerated as the patron saint of families, political prisioners, of amateur radio operators, of drug addicts and of the pro-life movement.
