This Week's Good News

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, we see another example of the harsh sayings of Jesus. This Lukan focus on the cost of discipleship and renouncing of possessions continues in the same vein from the Gospel passages we have heard over the last few weeks.

Just as when Jesus said that he had 'come to bring fire to the earth' (Lk.12 49:53), here we see Jesus telling the crowds who follow him as he makes his way to the cross in Jerusalem, that one cannot be a disciple of his unless he first hates his father, mother, wife and children, and indeed his own life.

He makes it clear that the cost of discipleship will require sacrifice. It will require the disciple to renounce his own life and take up his cross and follow Jesus, wherever that may lead.

Jesus is not advocating that his disciples seek division or feel hatred towards family. Rather, he is stressing the necessity for a disciple to place allegiance to God over any biological family. This is perhaps the hardest of all possessions to potentially renounce or give up, but there can be no half measures when wishing to follow Christ.

Extraordinary Ministers Holy Communion & Safeguarding.

Simon Moules, the Diocesan safeguarding co-ordinator will be coming to the parish hopefully on either the 1st week or 2nd week in September. This is to complete the safeguarding paperwork and DBS checks for those ministers who visit the sick and distribute communion outside of Mass.

There are currently no ministers who have a current DBS check and this precludes any visits outside of Mass until the DBS have been completed. Jane will contact those ministers who visit the sick/housebound.

Once this has been complete, Des will discuss with Fr Lee a suitable date to formally commission all EMHC at Mass, and provide everyone with their faculties which last for 5 years.

In addition, DBS checks will have to be completed on all members of the parish who are involved in any aspects of parish work who deal with children and/or vulnerable adults. This will include for example, Alter Servers & Children's liturgy.

St. Theresa of Lisieux Stansted is fully committed to ensuring strict adherence to all aspects of safeguarding. Thank You.

Sacramental Preparation

Confirmation 2020: An initial meeting will be arranged and announced shortly. I have been spoken to by a couple of people wishing to be confirmed next year. Can I request please that anyone wishing to be put forward as a candidate for confirmation, e-mail myself (Deacon Des), with name, age, (must be in Year 10 for the academic year 2019-2020) school attending, and date of Holy Communion and where it took place.

RCIA: 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults'. The course will begin on Sunday 15th September at 12 noon and will consist of 25 weekly sessions lasting 1 hour. If you are thinking of becoming a Catholic please contact Deacon Des.

Baptism Course: Please note that before a baptism can be arranged, the baptism course must be completed. The next baptism course will be held on Friday 13th September 7.30-8.30pm. To enrol on the course please e-mail Deacon Des.

Sacrament of Marriage: Catholics must approach the Parish Priest / Deacon, at least 6 months prior to their intended wedding, and before setting a wedding date.

Reconciliation: Reconciliation takes place half an hour before each Mass. Times are on the last page of the newsletter.

Home Visits for the Sick and Housebound: Please let us know if anyone is housebound (even if it is TEMPORARILY) so they can be visited and have the opportunity to receive Holy Communion at home. Mass is regularly broadcasted on the internet from the Catholic Church in Bishops Stortford: http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstortford

Admission to Hospital. Catholics in hospital are unlikely to receive an automatic visit from the Catholic Chaplain. If someone is sick in hospital, please let Fr Lee and/or Deacon Des know so that your loved one can be visited and receive Holy Communion and any other sacraments from the Chaplain.

Saint John Chrysostom, Bishop, Doctor

Feast 13th September

He was born in Antioch, he is generally considered the most prominent doctor of the Greek Church and the greatest preacher ever heard in a Christian pulpit. His sermons and writings did much to explain the Catholic faith and to encourage the living of the Christian life: his eloquence earned him the surname "Chrysostom", the Greek for "golden mouth".

After a thorough education, he took up the ascetic life. He was ordained to the priesthood, and became a fruitful and effective preacher. The content of his sermons, his exegesis of Scripture, were never without a point. Sometimes the point stung the high and mighty. Some sermons lasted up to two hours.

His lifestyle at the imperial court was not appreciated by many courtiers. He offered a modest table to episcopal sycophants hanging around for imperial and ecclesiastical favours. Many of his sermons called for concrete steps to share wealth with the poor. The rich did not appreciate hearing from John that private property existed because of Adam's fall from grace any more than married men liked to hear that they were bound to marital fidelity just as much as their wives were.

He was elected Patriarch of Constantinople in 397, and was energetic in reforming the ways of the clergy and the laity alike. He incurred the displeasure of the Emperor and was twice forced into exile. When the second exile, to Armenia, had lasted three years, it was decided that he should be sent still further away, but he died on the journey, worn out by his hardships.

Saint John Chrysostom is the Patron Saint of orators, preachers and speakers.
