


Blessed Be The Peacemakers – A Peaceful Saint: St Francis






Gather: Be Peaceful

peacemakers.




St Francis was born in a town in Italy called Assisi in 1182. His father was a wealthy cloth merchant and his mother was French. Francis grew up in a rich household, with all the luxuries money could buy.

Francis was a good student who loved to learn. His father wanted him to work within the family business.







When he was young he was well known for enjoying his family's wealth spending his money on fine clothes and enjoying himself at fancy parties.

Around the age of 19, Francis fought in a battle against the nearby town of Perugia. Francis was captured and imprisoned for nearly a year until his father paid the ransom and he was released.



Whilst in prison Francis began seeing visions of God, that changed his life forever.

One day, when Francis was out riding his horse, he came across a poor man suffering from leprosy. Instead of riding on he stopped, gave the man his cloak, some money and more importantly he kissed him, an outcast from society.





Then one day Francis was at a ruined chapel near Assisi, where, kneeling before the cross, he heard God speak to him.

The voice said "Go and repair my house which you see is close to ruin." Taking these words literally, he rushed home and took as much cloth as his horse could carry from his father's warehouse. He sold the cloth and horse and gave the money to the local priest to rebuild the church.





Francis' father was angry that his son had stolen his cloth. He summoned Francis to appear before the Bishop. Francis repaid the debt to his father and also took off all his clothes and presented them to him. The Bishop then clothed Francis in an old tunic. Francis then said that he now had only one father, his Father in heaven. He dedicated his life to the service of God, taking a vow of poverty, inspired by the rule of the apostles in the Gospel of Matthew.



As Francis lived out his life in poverty and preached about the life of Christ, he soon began to attract many followers. He had one simple rule which stated "To follow the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ and to walk in his footsteps." Francis then went on to Rome to seek Papal approval. After some time the Franciscan Order was eventually established.

St Francis lived out his life serving others. He died at the age of 44 in 1226 and his Feast Day is celebrated on 4th October.
