## This Week's Good News

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, John recounts Jesus encountering the money changers and the animal sellers in the Temple in Jerusalem. The Temple, the symbol of the Jewish religion, had become corrupted by the money changers and the animal sellers who charged exorbitant prices for the animals to be used in ritual sacrifice, bought by the people who were poor and being exploited by the Temple authorities who allowed this to happen and benefited financially from this corruption.

Jesus, consumed with zeal for his Father's house, drives out the agents of corruption and overturns the tables with the words, "Stop making my Father's house a marketplace." Many commentators see this understandably as a cleansing of the Temple of those who had distorted the Law to suit their own needs, and for their own benefit. More than a cleansing, Jesus' actions demonstrate that the glory of God was now to be found in a person rather than a building.

In response, the Jews demand a sign from Jesus to justify his actions. Jesus' reply confuses them, and they fail to understand the significance of what he says to them. "Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up." The Sadducees hear this as a literal destruction of the Temple, failing to understand that Jesus speaks of his future death and Resurrection. From now on, Jesus is the Temple that is the centre of faith and worship.

In our lives, we need to understand and recognise this. We need to cleanse our own lives of the money changers and animal sellers that sometimes stop us from respecting and obeying the word of God. We do this by how we love. How we treat those we meet and how we recognise Christ in everyone.

The theologian Karl Rahner once said, “The number one cause of atheism is Christians. Those who proclaim God with their mouths and deny Him with their lifestyles are what an unbelieving world finds simply unbelievable.” Today, if we listen to the word of God, the message of love and salvation, we can with God’s help, proclaim God with our mouths and our lifestyles and actions.

This is to enable us to maintain the numbers of people at each Mass/Service so that we comply with COVID-19 safety restrictions.

Bookings can be made from **10:00 a.m. on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> March** via our Website or by phone call to the Parish Office during opening times. Clair can be contacted on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Bookings will be made on a first come - first served basis. You will be contacted and given your seat allocation number nearer the time. Bookings for these Masses will stay open until **26<sup>th</sup> March**.
