#### This Week's Good News

Dear Friends,

Today's scriptural readings teach us the importance of always seeking spiritual nourishment rather than from physical food. We do this by regularly listening to the word of God and by receiving the Holy Eucharist – Bread from Heaven. It is only through God that we can satisfy our spiritual hunger and needs. However, God also provides for our physical needs, and this is seen in the first reading where God provides the Israelites in the desert with manna and quail. The Israelites were provided for, and this shows us to always trust in God for help in satisfying the physical needs we have in order to survive. The response to today's Psalm refers to manna as "heavenly bread' and the 'bread of angels' which God provided for Israel and provides for us today.

St. Paul, in the second reading, tells the Ephesians that they must turn away from their former lives and begin to lead renewed lives of love, kindness, compassion and forgiveness. If we acknowledge that Jesus is the source of our lives and provides genuine nourishment for our souls, we can experience a complete transformation.

The Gospel passage today is from the 'Bread of Life" discourse in John's Gospel.

Jesus tells the people to not long for food that does not last but rather look for the food that endures for eternal life. The people ask Jesus to give them the bread he speaks of always. Jesus tells them, "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." This passage reveals to us that Jesus not only gives the Bread of Life, but He is the Bread of Life. Jesus provides us with the spiritual nourishment we need to carry out his work here on earth and which will last forever in Heaven.

We believe that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian Life" because it contains the whole spiritual good of the Church. Jesus Christ, born, lived, suffered and died, and rose again to bring us salvation. (Lumen Gentium – Vatican II).

The Bread of Life, IS the risen Christ himself. It is not merely a symbol of remembrance using human bread. It is the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which sustains us, nourishes us, provides us with strength and courage, and the grace to overcome temptation and sin and to love others unconditionally. "Give us this day our daily bread', are the words we say during the Lord's prayer and before we come forward to receive the risen Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. When we say these words, let us remember that we are praying to receive food for our souls.

#### **Parish News**

Weekday Masses: Please note there will be no weekday Masses next week whilst Fr. Lee has his summer break. Weekday masses will recommence on **Monday 9**<sup>th</sup> **August**. Weekend Masses will continue as normal during this time.

**COVID Guidance:** From Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July many of the legal restrictions around measures to prevent the spread of COVID -19 were lifted in England. This does not mean that coronavirus has gone away. We will have to learn to live with COVID -19 for the foreseeable future, managing the risk for ourselves and others.

The guidance issued by the Bishops' Conference, whilst encouraging, enables us to move forward with a cautious approach, allowing us to take local infection rates etc. into consideration when keeping/removing certain restrictions.

The following guidance is in place at St. Theresa's for the time being:

- ➤ Holy Water Stoups are still not permitted.
- ➤ Holy Communion will continue to be under one kind and Fr. Lee/Deacon Des will continue to sanitise their hands beforehand. Communion is recommended to be distributed in the hand but those who wish to receive on the tongue may do so.
- The wearing of face coverings in church will be down to personal choice and is no longer required by law. We would encourage the continuation of masks if desirable.
- ➤ Benches will, for the time, being remain socially distanced with a view to moving everything back to normal in September 2021.
- ➤ We shall continue to provide hand sanitiser at the entrances/exit and encourage people to continue using them.
- We shall endeavour to keep the large front doors open to ensure some ventilation in church.
- ➤ We shall continue to clean the church, paying particular attention to common touch points such as door handles.
- ➤ Our QR Code will remain visible for those who wish to scan it via the NHS App.
- We ask anyone feeling unwell or anyone who tests positive for COVID to please stay at home.

Please familiarise yourselves with the location of the fire exits, extinguishers, and assembly points at this church.

At present it is the intention of the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, to reintroduce the Obligation to be at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation from the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent (28<sup>th</sup> November 2021), until that time, it remains suspended.

We shall look to slowly reintroduce those things that have been suspended due to COVID over the next few months and will of course communicate these with you. We will continue to follow the guidance issued and take local information into consideration to keep everybody as safe as we can. Thank you.
