

Hidden Harms

Hidden harm is **harm** or abuse that is usually **hidden** from public view occurring behind closed doors, often not recognised or reported. The emphasis is about spotting signs early and helping to prevent the risk escalation.

These are typically but not exclusively:

- Mental health abuse
- Exploitation (which includes online activity and other forms of abuse and harm which can include from peers)
- Domestic abuse
- Substance misuse
- Honour based abuse
- Forced marriage
- Modern Slavery and human trafficking
- Gang Violence
- Child Sexual Exploitation

What can I do?

It can be difficult to identify if a child, young person or vulnerable adult is suffering from hidden harm.

Indicators could include:

- Changes in behaviour
- Changes in character/personality
- Poor school attendance
- Missing Mass/Services attendance (that was always the usual pattern)
- Seeing vulnerable people where they should not be
- Change in appearance – unkempt, dirty, inadequate clothing
- Appears to have items e.g. jewellery, new phone, clothing- which they would not usually be able to afford
- Appears overly tired
- Self-harming signs
- Fabricated or induced illness

Changes in behaviour might include:

- Becoming unusually withdrawn
- Aggression and increasingly argumentative
- Sudden disrespectful attitude to others
- Over demanding
- Changes in friendships
- Excessively vigilant
- Seeking constant approval or affirmation
- Secretive
- Poor social relationships, difficulty mixing, compounded by isolation
- Taking unhealthy risks, including with drugs/alcohol/solvents
- Concerning social media and internet usage
- Associating with groups or new groups/older groups
- Changes to appearance influenced by gang association
- Inappropriate sexualised behaviour
