Our World

Pope Francis writing a second part of Laudato si': Speaking off-the-cuff to a delegation of lawyers from member countries of the Council of Europe on Monday, Pope Francis said he was writing a second part of his Laudato si' encyclical to update it to "current issues".

The Pope was expressing his appreciation for the attorneys' commitment to developing a legal framework aimed at protecting the environment.

"We must never forget that the younger generations have the right to receive a beautiful and livable world from us, and that this implies that we have a grave responsibility towards creation which we have received from the generous hands of God," said the Pope. "Thank you for your contribution."

In a later statement, the Director of the Holy See Press Office, Matteo Bruni, explained that the new updated version of Laudato si' will focus in particular on the most recent extreme weather events and catastrophes affecting people across five continents.

Laudato si' is Pope Francis' second encyclical letter. It was published on 18 June 2015, and bears the date 24 May of the same year, the Solemnity of Pentecost.

The document on the "care of the common home" draws its title from the incipit of St. Francis' Canticle of Creatures and opens with these words: "'LAUDATO SI', mi' Signore' – 'Praise be to you, my Lord'. In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. 'Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs".
