Our Gracious and Prayerful Thanks to ALL VOLUNTEERS: On behalf of the parish, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks and appreciation to all Parish Volunteers. We would struggle to survive if the services of these Volunteers were withdrawn. We are motivated by our Faith in the Risen Lord in all that we do or accomplish. Ultimately, it is God we serve. Two of the Biblical Texts which underpin our call to perform voluntary work, refer to God who will judge us at the end of time by recalling what we did and how we did it, plus what we did not do that we should have done. "...whenever you did this to one of the least of my brothers, you did it to me (Mat 25:40)....whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do it to me (Mat 25:45).

I will try to list some of the work that our kind and generous volunteers do for us: 1) Counting and Banking the Sunday Collection and donations. 2) Hoovering and Cleaning the Church. 3) The Cleaning and Caretaking of the Hall. 4) Cleaning the windows and doors of the Church and Hall. 5) Looking after the Church grounds by mowing the grass. 6) Assisting in different Liturgical Actions during the Mass. 7) Taking Holy Communion to the sick or housebound. 8) Looking after the Sacristy. 9) Serving the parish by giving the time and skills required in a parish group or committee. 10) Doing the Teas or Coffees after Mass. 11) Helping with Children's Liturgy, 12) Supporting/Starting a prayer group. 13) Helping with the Catechesis and Sharing your faith with those preparing to receive the Sacraments. 14) Doing the Church flowers and decorations. 15) Doing the ministry of greeting and welcoming. 16) Cutting the hedge, collecting the leaves and rubbish etc. 17) Checking the status of our heating, lights and water. 18) Health and Safety jobs. 19) Visiting fellow parishioners. 20) Offering to drive someone who needs a lift. Etc.

THE USE OF OUR PARISH CENTRE (HALL): Following my Newsletter Message about Parish Finances being in the red, it is my intention to offer hospitality to parishioners by letting them use our Parish Hall and request donations in return. Our parish hall is in real danger of closure at any time for being a white elephant. I would like to encourage each one of us to make use of our Parish Centre (Hall) in a way that will generate some income. Please get in touch with me if you would like to use the Hall so that I may explain further details and restrictions in place. A lot of Parish Halls in our diocese are closed. Many Parishes are struggling to pay for the upkeep and repairs/maintenance of the Hall. Our Parish Centre does not have funds and there is a real danger

of it being closed at any time. For example, we urgently need a new boiler for the Hall and I have a quote of £6000. I would like to start a Hall Fund (Hall Account) as soon as possible. I am very grateful to a parishioner who has given me a donation of £500 for the Hall. Please support me in this effort and your donations will be gratefully received and very much appreciated. The Diocesan levy (tax) of 26.5% will not apply to Donations given for the Hall. Thank you and may God Bless you.

We pray for the Sick and all who may need our prayers at this time especially Joanne Dellow and Stephen Craston. Please let me know if you would like your name to be included here.

Our Next Picnic Mass will be on Saturday 2nd December at 11.30 am: All children, their parents and grandparents are most welcome at this Mass. The last picnic Mass was very successful. We talked about starting the Children Liturgy at Mass, Monthly Children/youth Mass, Children/youth helping at Christ the King Mass, Children wearing crowns at Christ the King Mass, starting a parish play group with parents/grandparents, and starting to prepare for a Nativity Play at the Christmas Children Mass. Thank you all for your help and support in these endeavours.

The Month of Holy Souls: Thank you so much to those who have given me their November dead list. I am also grateful for the Mass intentions and Offerings you have given me. In November, the Church invites us to pray for the departed souls including, but not limited to, our departed parishioners and relatives. Please take Holy Souls envelopes for those who wish to book Mass intentions for their departed relatives. Thank you.

Month of Holy Souls - Sanctuary Candles: We are pleased to offer the chance to purchase a candle to be lit in loving memory of your departed loved ones. Each candle will have a printed label with the names of your departed loved ones on it. Each candle costs £5 and will remain lit for seven days. The sheets to "book" a candle are inserted in this week's newsletter and available on the table as you come into Church. Could we ask that those who wish to book a candle please fill in this sheet and return it and the payment to Fr Clement or Clair. Thank you.

Parish Finances: I have been touched by your very kind and generous response following my appeal to consider increasing your contributions, for those who may find it possible. Given the rising cost of living and many families struggling, it is fairly obvious the parish finances are affected. I am very touched and forever grateful for your generosity and support. For those who can give their contributions online, please take the Standing Order forms which are in the Church entrance.

Two urgent Parish Projects: Following the recent Finance Committee meeting, I learned that we do need a New Boiler for the Parish Hall. We are required to have a minimum of three quotes and are currently looking for quotes in order to establish how much it will cost. The second project is Built-in Sacristy Cupboards so that vestments may be kept well. I have been told that this project was always intended to be done and the drawings are available. I am looking for joiners to provide the quotes. I will keep you informed with the progress.

Tea and Coffee after Mass in the Hall: THANK YOU to one and all who remain behind to spend a little more time together sharing tea or coffee every Sunday after Mass. No problem if you are unavailable this Sunday because of other commitments, but please do plan to share some time after Mass with fellow parishioners at least twice a month. I would like to appeal for more volunteers to help me with this endeavour. We need two volunteers per Sunday to help with the preparation. Please have a look at the Rota in the entrance to see when you are able to volunteer. The more the merrier! Thank you for your help.

Tea and Coffee Rota: Suzanne Shutes has kindly agreed to look after the Rota for Tea/Coffee after Sunday Mass. On behalf of the parish, I am very grateful for her help and support. If for any
