HALL FUND: I thank you immensely for generous donations I have received for the Hall Fundso far £1000 has been received but we still need much more. Our Parish Centre does not have funds and there is a real danger of it being closed at any time. For instance, we urgently need a new boiler for the Hall and I have a quote of £6000. Please support me in this effort. Your vital donations will be so gratefully received and very much appreciated. The diocese has helped me to successfully set up the Hall Fund without having to open a new bank account. This is the message I received: "In respect of being able to track income and expenditure for the parish hall- this can be easily done by using a designated Fund for the Parish Hall. A 'Hall Fund' has been set up for the parish. This means that any donations received, or payments made in respect of the hall can be recorded on the parish finance system using the 'Hall' fund instead of the general fund. This allows separate income/expense reports to be produced for the Hall, but also allows consolidated reports to be produced when reporting at year end- therefore no need to set up additional accounts within the chart of accounts for the hall."

First Holy Communion Lessons: We have started our First Holy Communion Lessons for 2023/2024, with the First Holy Communion Mass taking place on Sunday 2nd June 2024. Any new candidates who wish to join our current programme will be asked to start the lessons in September next year with the new group of candidates. The dates to enrol the 2024/2025 programme will be announced after Christmas. We would look to enrol candidates before the start of the summer 2024 holidays with lessons starting in September 2024. On behalf of the parish, I am sincerely grateful to Bernadette who is doing so much in leading the First Holy Communion Programme.

Our Gracious and Prayerful Thanks to ALL VOLUNTEERS: On behalf of the parish, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks and appreciation to all Parish Volunteers. We would struggle to survive if the services of these Volunteers were withdrawn. We are motivated by our Faith in the Risen Lord in all that we do or accomplish. Ultimately, it is God we serve. Two of the Biblical Texts which underpin our call to perform voluntary work, refer to God who will judge us at the end of time by recalling what we did and how we did it, plus what we did not do that we should

I will try to list some of the work that our kind and generous volunteers do for us: **1**) Counting and Banking the Sunday Collection and donations. **2**) Hoovering and Cleaning the Church. **3**) The Cleaning and Caretaking of the Hall. **4**) Cleaning the windows and doors of the Church and Hall. **5**) Looking after the Church grounds by mowing the grass. **6**) Assisting in different Liturgical Actions during the Mass. **7**) Taking Holy Communion to the sick or housebound. **8**) Looking after the Sacristy. **9**) Serving the parish by giving the time and skills required in a parish group or committee. **10**) Doing the Teas or Coffees after Mass. **11**) Helping with Children's Liturgy, **12**) Supporting/Starting a prayer group. **13**) Helping with the Catechesis and Sharing your faith with those preparing to receive the Sacraments. **14**) Doing the Church flowers and decorations. **15**) Doing the ministry of greeting and welcoming. **16**) Cutting the hedge, collecting the leaves and rubbish etc. **17**) Checking the status of our heating, lights and water. **18**) Health and Safety jobs. **19**) Visiting fellow parishioners. **20**) Offering to drive someone who needs a lift. Etc.

Our Next Picnic Mass will be on Saturday 2nd December at 11.30 am: All children, their parents and grandparents are most welcome at this Mass. The last picnic Mass was very successful. We talked about starting the Children's Liturgy at Mass, Monthly Children/youth Mass, Children/youth helping at Christ the King Mass, Children wearing crowns at Christ the King Mass, starting a parish play group with parents/grandparents, and starting to prepare for a Nativity Play at the Christmas Children Mass. The Month of Holy Souls: Thank you so much to those who have given me their November dead list. I am also grateful for the Mass intentions and Offerings you have given me. Holy Souls envelopes are available for those who wish to have Mass offered for their departed relatives.

We are required to have a minimum of three quotes and are currently looking for quotes in order to establish how much it will cost. The second project is for Built-in Sacristy Cupboards so that vestments may be kept well. I have been told that this project was always intended to be done and the drawings are available. I am looking for joiners to provide the quotes. I will keep you informed with the progress.

All-year round Prayerful Dedication of a seven-day 24/7 Lit Candle. The practice of lighting a candle and dedicating it in prayer is so ancient and ever beautiful. Currently we are asking parishioners to dedicate these candles in memory of the departed loved ones. The act of lighting a votive candle at the altar, before an icon, a relic and statue is an act of communion with Our Lord. We light a candle and then we walk away but the candle continues to shine as a symbol of love and devotion and a physical, tangible reminder of our faith in the mercy, compassion, and love of God. I intend to promote this practice after the month of holy Souls. We should promote this practice of lighting the votive candles at the Statues of Our Lady, St Theresa and St Anthony of Padua. Each candle costs £5 and will remain lit for seven days as I pray for your intentions during the week. The other usual votive candles which usually last for two hours when lit are also available and you can use them too. Thank you.
