The Sacrament of Confirmation: Three young parishioners have asked if we could help prepare them to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Are there any more young people who would like to Receive the Sacrament of Confirmation? Please let me know as soon as possible so that all the concerned are consulted. The final date of application is 31st January and the Lessons will begin.

Flower Donation Box: We now have a box in the entrance hall (the old intentions box) for flower donations. These funds will go towards flowers for the church, especially at Christmas and Easter. Flowers are really expensive these days. Thank you for your support.

Cashless Donation Point: I have purchased a Cashless Donation Gadget which will be placed at a Cashless Donation Point at the entrance of the Church - it can also be taken to the Hall when having tea/coffee after Mass, and at any other event or meeting. The gadget is operated by SumUp, a global financial technology company based in London. There are no monthly subscription fees. However, like any other financial or banking institution, there will be very small transactional charges but this is not a problem - I have carefully considered this point and concluded that the benefits of a cashless donation gadget are greater. I have signed up this gadget to our parish bank account so that all donations are forwarded to our Account. Many parishes are doing the same. You can use any card or contactless payment method. It is easy and safe to use. The instructions are right next to it, if needed. Thank you for your generosity.

Prior to this, I had received a few requests from parishioners if I could make Cashless Donation an option available for everyone in the parish. One of the parishioners who wrote to me said this: "When you go to something at the church, it's cash only. That excludes those of us that prefer to pay by card. I've skipped coffee mornings I would have liked to attend, because I was out of cash. I try to keep coins for church, but it's difficult. It's not me. I've heard others express the same feelings. I hope we uncover an untapped source of income from people that prefer card payments and it turns out to be a benefit to our church."
