Mass book (P.137) Gospel: Mark 1:40-45 1st Reading: Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-45

Psalm 31:1-2: You are my refuge, O Lord; you fill me with the joy of salvation.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of

our mind, so that we can see what hope his call holds for us. Alleluia!

Jesus heals a leper in the Gospel of this Sunday. Having encountered, tackled and defeated the devil in the man who was possessed (Mk 1:25), Jesus embarks on his ministry of healing. The woman who remains nameless, St Peter's mother in-law, was the first person to be healed. Jesus heals her by touching her and raising her up. The second person to be healed by Jesus was a leper, a man who also remains nameless (Mk 1:41). Jesus does this by breaking the law of the land that forbade the touching of lepers and women who were considered to be unclean. In keeping with the law (see today's first reading), contact with any unclean person made the other person unclean too. Jesus distances himself from "man-made laws" and astoundingly, reaches out and touches the untouchables. Jesus shows us that the real value of a person is inside, not outside. A person's body may be deformed, diseased or aged but to God, there is no human being who is of a lesser value. As Christians, our mission is to reach out to everyone with a compassionate touch of Jesus. We can fulfil this mission of Christ only if we let ourselves to be touched and healed by Jesus. In a way, we are all like the people with leprosy in the Bible because we have all been deformed by the ugliness of sin. God is willing to touch everyone. As we celebrate the holy Mass, God gives us the opportunity to be touched and healed by Jesus, the Blessed Sacrament, fully present in the Mass.

The Season of Lent starts this week - ASH Wednesday Masses at 12.00 pm and 7.30 pm on 14th February. Everyone is expected to partake in this opening Mass of the holy Season of Lent.

"Come, follow me and I will send you out to fish for people" - Mark 1:17

The practice of lighting a candle and dedicating it in prayer is so ancient and ever beautiful.

The act of lighting a votive candle at the altar, before an icon, a relic and statue is an act of communion with Our Lord. We light a candle and then we walk away but the candle continues to shine as a symbol of love and devotion and a physical, tangible reminder of our faith in the mercy, compassion, and love of God. We should promote this practice of lighting votive candles at the Statues of Our Lady, St Theresa and St Anthony of Padua. 7 Day Sanctuary candles are available to light, we ask for a minimum donation of £5 per candle. Votive candles are also available and light for two hours for which we request a minimum donation of 20p per candle. Thank you.

Flower Donation Box: We now have a box in the entrance hall (the old intentions box) for flower donations. These funds will go towards flowers for the church, especially at Easter. Thank you for your support.
