"Come, follow me and I will send you out to fish for people" (Mark 1:17) – this was the Gospel of the First Sunday of Ordinary Time that inspired me to invite all volunteers and parishioners to a General Meeting taking place in the Parish Hall after the Vigil Mass this Saturday. In response to this Gospel, the question or challenge is this: how do we build up a united and friendly parish that is outward looking? The Gospel is like a net, lifting people from dark waters into the light of day and transforming their lives. How can God use me and you to fish for people's souls? How can we, as Christians and parishioners, encourage each other to find new seas and cast new nets where waters have never been fished before? Where are you casting your net?

Brotherhood, the Inner Life of Monks: If possible, please do watch this Documentary on BBC iPlayer: Brotherhood, the Inner Life of Monks. Given the way the BBC has removed "Songs of Praise" from its' traditional Prime Time, I am amazed it is currently promoting this religious program. I have watched this program a few times under the title "Outside the City". Here, you will be able to see Brother Laurence who recently visited us. The BBC shows the monks of Mount St Bernard Abbey, a community of 25 men, more than half of whom are over 80 years old, opening the first Trappist Brewery in the UK. The BBC continue to say that for their historic, countercultural lifestyle (as monks) to survive, this venture of the Brewery must succeed. Furthermore, the BBC emphasises the fact that as the monks reflect on spirituality, ageing and the end of life, the number of burials in the abbey graveyard continues to grow. Please pray for more vocations to the monastery, priesthood and religious life. I have watched this program here: BBC Four - Brotherhood: The Inner Life of Monks.

The Partnership of the Catholic Parishes of Stansted and Saffron Walden: Bishop Alan is currently overseeing a number of changes across the diocese. As a parish, we have been asked to establish a partnership with the Catholic Parish in Saffron Walden. Declining numbers of the clergy coupled with declining of both members of the congregation and parish income, have necessitated these changes throughout the diocese. Members of the parish are being asked to take an active role volunteering to support the running of the affairs of their parish while the priest will remain focused on the expanding pastoral matters. Representatives of both Stansted and Saffron Walden parishes will be asked to meet soon to discuss this matter. I will let you know more details once I have met with Fr. David Clemens, the parish priest of Saffron Walden Catholic Church. Let us pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to guide us all in this challenge.

St Theresa's "Picnic Mass Group", consisting of parents/grandparents with their little children will meet for a friendly social time on Wednesdays with Fr. Clement in the Parish Hall at 10.00 am - 12.00 pm. This is a good opportunity to meet fellow Catholics instead of staying at home alone with your children. Please advertise this event and invite your friends of the same faith and all faiths, or none. This could be one of the beautiful ways to connect our parish to the wider community as we all endeavour to be outward looking and outreaching to everyone in accomplishing the Mission of Christ.

Every Friday Prayer Group in Lent beginning at 7.00 pm with Stations of the Cross, Adoration and ending with Mass at 8.30pm. Everyone is invited. Please do make a special effort to attend during this holy season of Lent.

We light a candle and then we walk away but the candle continues to shine as a symbol of love and devotion and a physical, tangible reminder of our faith in the mercy, compassion, and love of God. We should promote this practice of lighting votive candles at the Statues of Our Lady, St Theresa and St Anthony of Padua. 7 Day Sanctuary candles are available to light, we ask for a minimum donation of £5 per candle. Votive candles are also available and light for two hours for which we request a minimum donation of 20p per candle. Thank you.

Flower Donation Box: We have a box in the entrance hall for flower donations. These funds will go towards flowers for the church, especially at Easter. Thank you for your support.
