

Listen! The key action word in the Gospel today is Listen. **Listening to Jesus** is neither a request nor a piece of advice. It is a command! Listening to anything or anyone else is not an alternative. The Gospel of Mark is keen to highlight that Jesus is the true Son of God and not the Emperor who is a mere creature. The Emperor of that time was Tiberius Augustus and he was considered as "the son of the divine god" and the Roman Currency carried this message. Tiberius was adopted as a son of the first Emperor, Augustus, who was venerated and even worshipped as a divine god. Seeing the insanity and absurdity of this claim, the Gospel of Mark sets off with a brave and fundamental first amendment: Jesus is the true Son of God. In the end, and in a colourful and dramatic way, the Gospel of Mark appoints the Emperor's Official, a Roman Centurion (Soldier), as the only person in the entire Gospel of Mark who acclaims Jesus as the Son of God – "and when the centurion, who stood there in front of Jesus, saw how he died, he said: Surely this man was the Son of God" (Mk 15:39).

Having encountered, tackled and defeated the devil in the First Sunday of Lent, today the Gospel of Mark invites us to the scene of the Transfiguration of Jesus where he is revealed as the beloved Son of God. We hear in the Gospel the Voice of God exalting Jesus above Moses and Elijah as the long-awaited Messiah with full divine authority. Jesus is neither one of the prophets nor a reincarnation of any one of them. As the Son of God, Jesus surpasses them in authority and power. The appearance of Moses and Elijah showed Jesus as the fulfilment of both the Old Testament and the prophetic promises.

Many voices in this world try to tell us how to be happy, how to live, and how to know God personally. Some of these voices are helpful, but the majority of them are not. Which voices am I listening to, which ones are misleading me, and which ones are wasting my time?

Let us Listen to God's Word in the Bible and then evaluate other voices and authorities in the light of God's revelation. Let us pray for the grace of deep listening and discernment of God's Will. Like Abraham in the first reading, God's Will might be strange and illogical to us. Yet when we do give to God what He asks, He returns to us far more than we could dream, and the spiritual benefits of His blessings far outweigh our sacrifices – you're never happier without Faith!



Some of the Prayers to use in Lent

The Memorare Prayer: Remember, O most loving Virgin Mary, that it is a thing unheard of, that anyone ever had recourse to your protection, implored your help, or sought your intercession, and was left forsaken. Filled therefore with confidence in your goodness I fly to you, O Mother, Virgin of virgins, to you I come, before you I stand, a sorrowful sinner. Despise not my poor words, O Mother of the Word of God, but graciously hear and grant my prayer. Amen. (Please note there are other traditional versions/translations available).

A Prayer to St Joseph: O Blessed Joseph, husband of Mary, be with us this day. You protected and cherished the Virgin; loving the child Jesus as your Son, you rescued Him from the danger of death. Defend the Church, the household of God, purchased by the blood of Christ. Guardian of the Holy Family, be with us in our trials. May your prayers obtain for us the strength to flee from error and wrestle with the powers of corruption so that in life we may grow in holiness and in death rejoice in the crown of Victory. St Joseph, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Amen

A **Prayer to St Michael:** Holy Michael, the Archangel, defend us in the day of battle. Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God thrust down to hell Satan and all the evil spirits who wander through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen

A prayer to my Guardian Angel: Angel of God, my Guardian dear, God's Love for me has sent you here. Ever this day be at my side, to light and rule, to guard and guide. Amen

We light a candle and then we walk away but the candle continues to shine as a symbol of love and devotion and a physical, tangible reminder of our faith in the mercy, compassion, and love of God. We should promote this practice of lighting votive candles at the Statues of Our Lady, St Theresa and St Anthony of Padua. 7 Day Sanctuary candles are available to light, we ask for a minimum donation of £5 per candle. Votive candles are also available and light for two hours for which we request a minimum donation of 20p per candle. Thank you.

Flower Donation Box: We now have a box in the entrance hall (the old intentions box) for flower donations. These funds will go towards flowers for the church, especially at Easter. Thank you for your support.
