The Funeral of Rev. Fr. Anthony Dolan: It was a blessing for me to be a part of a large congregation, both clergy and lay, attending and praying in the requiem Mass last Tuesday for this holy priest in Nottingham Catholic Cathedral. Fr. Tony was a good friend of many years. He visited and stayed with me here last year, on his way to Rome. I was touched by one of the quotations in his funeral booklet which I will share with you.

"The saddest thing to me, in looking back in my life, has been to recall the preference I have so often shown for what is inferior, tenth-rate, when the first-rate was there for the having. Like a man who goes shopping, and comes back with cardboard shoes when he might have had leather, with dried fruit when he might have had fresh, with processed cheese when he might have had cheddar, with paper flowers when the primroses were out."

The quotation is from Chronicles of Wasted Time Volume Two, The Infernal Grove, by Malcolm Muggeridge. Please pray for the happy repose of Fr. Tony's soul. As attested by the Gospel of his Funeral Mass (John 13), Fr. Tony lived and believed very much in the washing of the feet of everybody he met in his life regardless of one's creed, race and status in life. I was moved by his witness.
