Repatriation of Sabina Uche's mortal remains to Nigeria: As we could not find Sabina's passport, we managed to obtain an Emergency Travel Document (ETD) from the Nigerian Embassy. Sabina's body can be repatriated now. The cost of the Repatriation given by the local funeral directors is £7500. We then found other providers asking for about £4500. I contacted a friend who runs Chris Meynell & Family Funeral **directors** from my last parish, who said they can do it at cost price which is £3800. All these prices do not include transport from a Nigerian airport to Sabina's village. As a parish, we do not have a hardship fund within our parish accounts which is why I am appealing to everyone to help me raise £4000 for repatriation of our fellow parishioner. For many years, Sabina was a committed Catholic in this parish. Her life, contexts and death have touched us all. Sabina's body was nearly getting disposed of via direct cremation by Uttlesford Environmental Services as no one was coming forward to claim her for a month. Our Tribute in her memory is the prayers for her happy repose as we offer our donations to pay for the repatriation costs.
