For health and safety reasons, access to and use of the kitchen are not permitted until essential work is done. The insurance is expected to pay for all the costs. This work may take weeks and months to be completed. However, in a couple of weeks' time, we will create temporary Tea/Coffee Station within the Hall so that a limited use of the Hall may be allowed to resume as usual. I am so sorry for this inconvenience but most importantly, please let us all pray for the driver, one of us, who was involved in this shocking accident.
